**INCREASED REGULATORY FOCUS BY THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL
(OSFM) – CERTIFIED COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL SERVICES AND SUPPORTS (CCRSS)**

Dear Certified Community Residential Services and Supports Provider:

WA State CCRSS facilities are responsible for ensuring consistent compliance with all applicable federal and state fire safety and life safety code (LSC) regulatory requirements.

OSFM has identified widespread fire alarm functionality concerns which place CCRSS residents and staff at potential risk. As a result, OSFM is increasing regulatory focus on existing semiannual regulatory requirements.

Current fire safety and LSC regulatory information, specific to CCRSS is provided below.

WA State regulatory requirements for OSFM include:

- [Chapter 212-12 RCW](#) – Fire Marshal Standards; and
- [Chapter 43.44 RCW](#) – State Fire Protection.

Supported Living clients rent their home or apartment. Effective March 15, 2024, the International Fire Code became effective in all counties of the State of Washington.

WA State fire safety regulatory guidance for supported living includes:


