# ALTSA: NH #2025-003 INCREASED REGULATORY FOCUS BY THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL (OSFM) – NURSING HOME

Dear Nursing Facility/Home Administrator:

WA State nursing homes (NH) are responsible for ensuring consistent compliance with all applicable federal and state fire safety and life safety code (LSC) regulatory requirements.

OSFM has identified widespread fire alarm functionality concerns which place NH residents and staff at potential risk. As a result, OSFM is increasing regulatory focus on existing semiannual regulatory requirements.

Current fire safety and LSC regulatory information, specific to nursing homes is provided below.

#### WA State regulatory requirements for OSFM include:

- Chapter 212-12 RCW Fire Marshal Standards; and
- Chapter 43.44 RCW State Fire Protection.

### OSFM uses regulations outlined in the following documents to complete fire safety and LSC regulatory tasks for nursing homes:

- Life Safety Code (LSC) and 2012 edition of the NFPA 99 Health Care Facilities Code (HCFC); and
- NFPA 101A Guide to Life Safety, 2013 edition (2013 FSES)
