Anna manages the Reentry Program in Clark County Jail as well as other departmental initiatives related to behavioral health. She has a master's degree in social work from Portland State University and is a licensed independent clinical social worker in Washington. She was the first civilian hired by the corrections branch at Clark County Jail to work in the Reentry Program. Her career spans over 25 years including 10 years in carceral facilities with a focus on high-risk populations including incarcerated persons, acute mental illness, substance use disorders including opioid treatment, drug courts, homeless veterans, foster care, sexual assault services, psychiatric inpatient treatment and more. Anna specializes in program development and grant management, is a federal grant reviewer, and provides consultation on grants to local organizations. Anna is a 2016 Leadership Clark County graduate.
