# Purpose:

To provide information to CSD staff when contacted by people who want <del>chemical</del> <del>dependencysubstance use</del> treatment services.

### **Clarifying Information**

1. The Division of Behavioral Health and Recovery (DBHR) Health Care Authority (HCA) contracts with the counties to provide outpatient chemical dependency treatment services to low income clients who are not eligible for any public assistance program or only eligible for food assistance provides funding and oversight for substance use treatment services for people

- enrolled in Apple Health (Medicaid). The HCA provides behavioral health and recovery services including alcohol use treatment, medication assisted treatment, and opioid use treatment.
